### **Our Schools Now – Austin Cox**

- A decrease of 1.2 billion dollars each year is given to Utah schools. We are losing fifty percent of our teachers due to lack of resources/funding. However, Roy schools, Salt Lake City School Districts, and Toole districts all were given extra money and saw significant benefits in graduation rates and the success of students.
- OSN would include an increase from 5.0 to 5.45% in the state income tax
- The contribution would be representative of a person's income. The more a person makes, the more is contributed.
- 15% would go to higher education funds.
- Money could be used for degrees and certificates awarded, graduate research, workforce needs.
- 113,143 Signatures needed
- Must get them by April 15, 2018- goal is by the end of this year.

**WELCOME:** Michael moved to skip to budget approvals before our guest speaker Pat Jones.

### **Public Forum:**

**Board of Regents Patricia Jones:** Mental health is one of the most prevalent problems on Utah campuses. Utah has not participated in the past with mental health campaigns until recently. Recommendations:

- 1. Assess the mental health and wellness needs of the Utah students; every institution will gather data about their specific college and report back.
- 2. Improve mental health education at all Utah institutions- increasing awareness and the ability to refer students as needed. Each institution will provide mental health first aid training to all faculty. All in favor of saving lives. Students will be required to receive mental health training. People will be put in place at our institutions to help implement these campaigns.
- 3. Increase Access to Mental Health Services- working with the community and region to increase access to resources for mental health. WICHE brings in interns working on their doctorates to provide more mental health support. Increase after hours and weekend hours for counseling/psychological help. Implement SafeUT around Utah as well as a representative on each campus.

4. Develop institutional five-year mental health implementation plan- when an institution hosts the board of regents, the institution will present on progress and efforts on mental health issues.

Mental health problems are more relevant today more than ever.

**WELCOME:** Michel welcomed Brayden O'Brian and the approval of the minutes with a unanimous approval. Meeting minute approval will be continued through email.

Budget Approvals: Lola led the budget approvals. Unanimous approval, approval will be continued through email. Rob: concerns on student fees being used to pay for USA. Students throughout Utah campuses are paying the same amount of fifteen cents that goes toward the USA budget. Budget may be lowered next year to eliminate the extra \$15,000 left over. Linda: the USA is not designed to focus on the needs of individual schools but on Utah students as a whole. Understanding the needs of each other's campuses and the networking that comes from the Utah Student Association is vital to improving issues that are present on all of our campuses. The 15 cent fee can be brought down, USA has only been what it is for the past 3 years. Rob: is the main function of our board to support each other or to lobby for bills we find important? If it is just a support group, should presidency stipends be administered? Lola: understanding what the USA board actually is, is so important for the next presidency to understand. This board is not necessarily for the passing of bills but for the bettering of the students of Utah as a whole. Brayden: USA should be available for ideas for each other, but this body, more than any others, is the most impactful when it comes to passing bills for the welfare of students. No one represents the utah student body more than this group and has more of an impact for the students. Michael: we come to this meeting thinking less of our personal institution and more of the

state of Utah as a whole. Possible clarification in the USA mission- we come together for the purpose of *all* of the Utah students. USA is more of a collective good.

# Higher Ed Day- Brayden O'Brien:

Lobbying- communicating with a public official for the purpose of influencing either the passage, amendment, or postponement of legislative or executive action. Lobbyist provide accurate information to legislators. In 2017, USA declared mental health a crisis and urged organizations to work together to improve resources available to students. They also urged student body members to create a report "Board of Regents Mental Health Working Group Report and Recommendations" Follow up with legislators about progress made, our \$8 million dollar request to help improve mental health services. Tips for meeting with our legislators include being prompt, patient and flexible. Be personal-make connections and thank them for their time. Keep things short and focused - no more than 10-15 minutes. Be credible and to the point- professional but firm and always send a follow-up. Statistics are great, but making your point personal and relevant is even more impactful. The key message to impart to the legislators: Thank them for supporting our bills past in 2017, examples of what we each are doing on our own campuses to solve the Mental Health problem, and focus on our attempt to gain funds to implement those changes. Student Civil Liberties Protection Act- Brayden specifically promoted looking more into this act. Lola: if we are awarded this funding, will it be put toward the mental health initiatives we are trying to implement now? Michael: the university presidents and student body presidents will attend a meeting to decide how the money is administered.

#### **Mental Health Video:**

Spread throughout our different forms of social media, also will be posted on our USA website. Mental Health does not define us, we can start over. Will be shared through the USA facebook as well. Direct people to the website and the facebook page. Lola: organize our focus and statistics for mental health and post on our website.

### **New Business-Lola**

**Student Regent Applications:** same student regent will not be appointed again. Promotion of Student Regent Application to students who you believe would be an asset to USA and the students. USA presidency will go through the applications and choose the top 8 for the presidents to vote on in April. The top three will be sent to the Governor to choose from. The deadline to apply is March 26 and applications are submitted online. Alex: if needed a presentation can be put together to explain what a Student Regent does and brought to our individual campuses. Presidents: reach out personally to people you know would be a great addition to the Board of Regents.

Lola: proposal to meet before our April training to discuss what we want to convey to the new presidency next year. Ezra: meeting the night before to prepare the presidents in a more casual setting and allow them to get to know each other. April 5-6 a possible Airbnb with the new presidents to promote bonding and to help answer questions.

# **Mental Health Initiatives throughout our Campuses:**

**USU:** Resilience trainings to promote coping strategies. QPR training is included for all councils. Student fee created to increase access to counseling. Two new counselors hired and a new class created to learn about mental health. Aggie Heros created for students to speak about different physical/mental challenges they have overcome. Talks are recorded and promoted through social media. Mental Health week dedicated to understanding and supporting the mental well being of the students. Suicide awareness walk to promote understanding.

**UVU:** Last week was dedicated toward mental health. \$75 cent increase in student fees to bring 1 counselor to every 3000 students. Avoiding increasing student fees specifically toward mental health to avoid legislators leaving more funding up to the students themselves. Physical health was promoted last year in hope to help in turn with mental health.

**WSU:** New counselor hired, educating students on how to help themselves in regard to mental health. Self-help tips are being distributed through campus. Self-help is being promoted and how to learn the difference between a "hard time" and a "crisis". T-shirts will be distributed throughout the campus in February to learn more about different resources available to students.

**SLCC:** Mirror decals in various bathrooms, working on coming up with a mental health video throughout the different campuses. Opening new gyms in south city and Jordan campus. Expanding two new counseling centers.

**DSU:** relocation of Health and Counseling Center closer to campus, implementation of \$5 fee increase to enable free counseling to all students. New fitness center will be completed in a year and a half. The Hope Squad is now a practicum class and offering QPR training. Working on finding ways to get more people involved in the Hope Squad. Mirror decals in various bathrooms. Group counseling sessions have improved the wait time to see a counselor. First Master's program being approved.

**SNOW:** Student fee increase brought about a counselor to the richfield campus. Working on finding more space for counseling. Handouts and food being handed out to promote the counseling services. All student leadership receiving QPR training.

**Alex (Board of Regents):** Listening tour to ask students questions about how the Regents can help with timely completion- touring the different campuses throughout Utah.

Michael moved to adjourn the meeting, Lola seconded, motion passed.

## Action Items:

- Discuss April 5th-6th Airbnb retreat with the new presidents to help them feel more comfortable with each other and provide a place to ask the new presidency questions. \*will require approval of the budget\*
- If needed, Alex can put together a presentation about the Student Regent Application for each school to give more details about what it entails.
- Be thinking about students who would be interested in becoming next year's Student Regent, and reach out to them.
- Work on promoting the Mental Health video through the USA website/facebook page (it will be up on both sites soon)
- Find out all of the interns from your school at the capital to set up meetings with. (some legislators only allow meetings through these interns.) The state capital website will have the links to the contact information with these interns. Meetings can be set up between 11-2pm.
