- USA Elections

 - o BYU is not a state institution, do not have a vote

- Welcome
- Approval of last meetings minutes
 - Moved: President VanderToolen/Seconded: President Alder/Vote: Unanimous
- Elections for USA Presidency
 - o Mr. Lake read the responsibilities of the presidency and president.
 - Nominees included President Simons, President Alder, and President VanderToolen. A motion was made to close nominations by President Alder, seconded by President Simons, and unanimously voted upon. The board then decided to hear two minutes of presentation with questions to follow.
 - O President Simons: I'm from SLCC and my pronouns are she/her. I am a non-traditional student, and it was difficult to go back to school as I feared feeling a sense of belonging. I was proven wrong. I felt like I belonged, and I want all students to feel that way. I want to focus on two things: connections and collaboration. Building relations when we go through something hard or need advice. Once we have established those relationships, we can learn how to work together. I want us to all be able to use our unique perspectives to problem solve. This is my second year and I believe I have necessary experience.
 - President Rice: What would you like to accomplish this year that you didn't this year.
 - President Simons: We missed out on building connections. We didn't use each other as resources throughout the year like I feel like we could have.
 - O President Alder: Please reference the paper I handed out for what I want to deliver on. I'm a very empathetic leader and I want to emphasize our voices with our initiatives. I recognize that we are busy with our schedules and timetables. I want to be realistic. I want to help lead our group. USU is present in almost all of our counties, so I understand the diverse needs of our state. I have time to dedicate to this organization. I'm very familiar with USHE and have worked with them before. We need to update the constitution, create a welcome packet for all students, and advocate against the 5.75% proposed student increase. The things I want to change in the constitution is update the portion about the budgets and stipends. Also, explore the need of the legislative vice president.

- President VanderToolen: I want this group to contribute to things statewide. I
 want our students to benefit the whole state. I want to understand all your
 initiatives and work to move things to USHE and other state departments. I'll
 keep you all in loop.
 - President Rice: What would you like to do to get the University of Utah back in the picture?
 - President VanderToolen: Getting our advisors more involved with USA and mend relationships with this group as well as UPSIL. I want to open communication channels.
- President Simons and President Alder were the nominees and President Alder was ultimately voted to be the new USA President for the 2022-2023.
- President Alder then went through the responsibilities of the Executive Vice President. President Simons and President Soto were the two nominees interested in the position. The representative filling in for President Soto, Mr. Bennett, spoke for President Soto.
- Mr. Bennett: Lexi has hit the ground running. Lexi was one of the best senators last year, in my opinion. She is very dedicated. You can definitely rely on her. She is a business major and has that kind of experience.
 - President Rice: Why was she interested in this over the president?
 - Mr. Bennett: She wanted to focus on things at UVU.
- President Simons: I want to emphasize that I support Clara. I would love to work with her. I have prior experience that I can bring along with the interests of our different campuses.
 - President VanderToolen: What were some of your favorite initiatives last year
 - President Simons: At my school, we got free period products. I wish we could have worked more with different campuses, particularly the ones that already finished that initiative.
- The first initial vote was a tie. President Pollman was able to leave a meeting to hear the same presentations from the candidates and cast his vote. After a revote, President Simons was selected as the Executive Vice President.
- O President Alder then explained the responsibilities and duties of the Legislative Vice President. Mr. Bennett indicated that President Soto was interested in the position. President Simons nominated President VanderToolen who rejected the nomination. President Soto was voted on and approved as the Legislative Vice President.
- The board unanimously approved closing the voting process with a motion from President VanderToolen and a second from Ms. Mortensen.
- Budget and fees
 - Ms. Zimmerman explained the previous years budget and the carry-over into this year of \$8,802.34.
- Advisors meeting update
 - Ms. Zimmerman explained that an advisors meeting took place yesterday during the UPSIL conference. She explained that colleges used to pay fifteen cents per full-time equivalent that went into the commissioner's office. That structure changed in 2013. Last year, USA collected five cents and all advisors felt

comfortable keeping that. They want to update the constitution. Westerminster would like to have a seat at the table again. Advisors suggested looking at the financial needs, which included the stipends for the presidency, the student regent interviews, and UPSIL. It is suggested the other meetings be moved exclusively to a virtual option. Typically, initiatives don't cost that much money. Advisors felt that if they did cost money, that it could be split up equally or the institution could simply pay for how the initiative is conducted on their campus. They would also like each institution to pay for their own dinners and meals while traveling for USA related business. That could also include private institutions being a part of the presidency if they are paying the same amount in fees.

- A discussion was opened regarding the fee for the upcoming year. President Rice indicated that lowering the fee would put a burden on his institution. President VanderToolen expressed concern over the perception of the costs moving exclusively to the institutions.
- President VanderToolen moved to table the discussion of setting a fee until September with a second from President Rice. The board unanimously approved.
- A motion was made by President VanderToolen to amend the agenda to explain the updated USA Website, Ms. Mortensen seconded, and the board approved.

Website

o Mr. Lake explained the updates to the website.

Constitution/House Rules

 President Alder announced that the USA Presidency will bring a draft in a future meeting of the constitution and house rules in a future meeting. Suggestions are welcome.

- A discussion was opened on frequency of meeting in person. President Simons expressed her appreciation for the every-other meeting being in-person. President Rice said he would like to meet at least once more in-person before April.

• President Alder explained that there will be a presentation tomorrow during the UPSIL conference introducing USA and Katie Mazzie.

• Initiative's Discussion

O President VanderToolen expressed his desire to reduce his mental health professional sign-up time at his university. President Simons expressed her desire to advocate for undocumented students and become a support to them including prioritizing funding for them. President Alder discussed her desire to lobby the state to pay the full 5.75% increase for higher education rather than just threequarters of it and putting the remaining amount on institutions which would likely be paid through raising tuition. Mr. Bennett suggested working on making credits at institutions more transferrable to other institutions. The board decided to take the main initiative proposed and discuss those with institutional presidents and student councils to decide what was most important for each university. Those initiatives were to advocate for the state to pay the full 5.75%, focus on undocumented students in the state and how to best assist them, and mental health wait lists.

• Campus Updates

O President Rice said the campus community likes the new branding. They desire to make a big new impact with the new name. President VanderToolen expressed how his institution is trying to expand and improve. Ms. Mortensen said they are working on student involvement and marketing. President Baker is creating an app for student life. President Simons is wrapping up trainings for the year. Mr. Bennett is having a ribbon cutting ceremony for new dining on his campus. They are also working on cross-campus collaboration. President Alder discussed her statewide tour of all the USU campuses. President Rowley talked about how they have an interim president and no advisor. Snow is trying to get people back together post-covid. President Pollman discussed how his institution's president search will conclude tomorrow. SUU is focusing on mental health.
